

Five Amazing Facts about the Writing Lives of Great English Authors



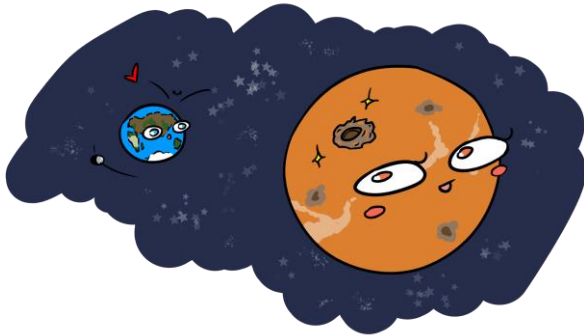
1. 83 crimes from her works are committed using poisoning. Agatha Christie excellently understood the intricacies of the subject, because she worked as a pharmacist.
